and longitudinal; scrobes reticulate, crossed by a few delicate rugules and bounded laterally by a longitudinal ruga; occiput, cheeks and sides of head more coarsely reticulate-rugose. Neck coarsely reticulate, thoracic dorsum reticulate-rugose, very coarsely on the pronotum, less sharply and less regularly on the mesonotum and base of epinotum; meso- and metapleurae, especially below, longitudinally rugose; declivity of epinotum sharply reticulate; nodes of petiole and postpetiole even more coarsely reticulate-rugose than the pronotum; gaster sharply but minutely reticulate throughout; scapes and legs with similar but less pronounced sculpture.

Pilosity glistening white, moderately abundant, short, coarse, obtuse, erect, even and uniformly distributed over the body and appendages, somewhat longer on the abdomen than on the head and thorax, more oblique on the legs, on the antennae somewhat finer, suberect on the scapes, subappressed on the funiculi. Pubescence undeveloped.

Brown-black or very dark brown; mandibles, antennae and legs, including the coxae, and tip of gaster slightly paler, castaneous; tarsi more reddish.

Described from four specimens taken May 6, 1928, by Señor L. Marato on Romblon Island, Philippines, and received from Dr. J. W. Chapman.
