practically absent except for a few near the antennal insertions and extending back from the frontal carinae. The gaster is also shining. Head, antennae, thorax, and nodes reddish yellow, mandibles and legs a little lighter in color; gaster brown to brownish yellow, the infuscation most noticeable dorsally. These differences are based on comparisons between *smithi* and specimens of *floridana* from Pensacola which were determined by Dr. Smith.
